**MATHEMATICS**

Two semesters of Calculus by end of Sophomore Year (Scholarship Program)

- MATH 151 - Calculus and Analytic Geometry I (4.00)
- MATH 152 - Calculus and Analytic Geometry II (4.00)

**SCIENCE**

Two semesters of Physics by end of Junior Year (Scholarship Program)

- PHYS 121 - Introductory Physics I (4.00)
- PHYS 122 - Introductory Physics II (4.00)

*Calculus and Physics MUST be taken on-campus at UMBC or another NROTC host University.*

College Program and Advanced Standing require lower level math and science courses with same timeline. Refer to the ROD for specific requirements (can be found on UMBC NROTC Website under Resources)

**WRITING**

Two semesters (6 credit hours) of courses that focus on grammar, composition, and require significant student writing. To be completed by the end of Sophomore Year. Courses that meet UMBC English and / or Writing Intensive GEP requirements qualify.

**EXAMPLE COURSES**

- ENGL 100 - Composition (3.00)
- ENGL 393 - Technical Communication (3.00)

*Note that writing-intensive course requirements vary for different majors.*
